There an upright person could reason with him, and I should be acquitted for ever by my judge.



Plymouth donors have several funding choices for making pledges. Cash payments are the most familiar, but there are two popular additional options. First, a gift of appreciated stock can avoid capital gains tax liability to the donor. For this option, the donor will need to be able to identify the cost basis in the stock. Second, a gift of a Qualified Charitable Distribution can be made from all or a portion of an IRA's required minimum distribution (RMD) of a member. This option can avoid tax liability on the donated portion of the RMD, but it must be paid directly to the church from the IRA's custodian. For either option, and to determine if additional tax-saving methods are available, it is imperative that the donor consult in advance with the donor's tax advisor.

2025 Pine Ridge Service-Learning Trip for Adults

After taking 4 youth service-learning trips to Pine Ridge Indian Reservation to work with the organization Re-Member (2014, 2015, 2018, 2022) Plymouth took the first senior group (55+) in September of 2023. Re-Member provides resources that improve the quality of life for the members of the Oglala Lakota Nation, and creates meaningful opportunities to build understanding for their volunteers. The week involves building bunk beds, outhouses, decks, and wheelchair ramps, as well as as a strong emphasis on cultural immersion. 


